Its flexible instrumentation allows the investigation of repertoire from chamber sized to full orchestral works. Future performances include:

Federico Piantini was born in the Dominican Republic and began violin studies at the Conservatory of Music of Santo Domingo. In 1981 he came to Philadelphia to study at Combs College of Music with David Grunschlag, and later with William Liva, former assistant to Ivan Galamian. He holds a Bachelor of Music in performance as well as a Master of Music in performance and education. Mr. Piantini has performed with many orchestras and ensembles in the Delaware Valley, including the Reading Symphony, Delaware Symphony, Trenton Symphony, Orchestra Society of Philadelphia, and the Lansdowne Symphony. With these last two, he has worked not only as a violinist, but also as conductor.

Jack Moore, Music Director of the Independence Sinfonia, is quite active in the Philadelphia area. For 17 years, he was conductor of the South Shore Symphony Orchestra, in Ocean City, NJ. In 1995, he was named Conductor of the Ambler Symphony, and was recently named Principal Conductor of the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia. He has participated in master classes with František Vájnár and Otakar Trhák in the Czech Republic; and with Alexander Polistchuk and Mikhail Kukushin of the St. Petersburg Conservatory in Russia. He also appeared in concert with the St. Petersburg Camerata, in the Hermitage Theater in St. Petersburg. Mr. Moore is a classical music announcer at Temple University Public Radio, WRTI, 90.1FM.
