In 1995 he was named conductor of the Ambler Symphony, and was recently named principal conductor of the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia. He has appeared in concert with the Hradec Kralové Philharmonic in the Czech Republic and with the Hermitage Chamber Orchestra in St. Petersburg. He is a classical music announcer at Temple University's public radio station, WRTI 90.1 FM.

Federico Piantini, Soloist, was born in the Dominican Republic and began violin studies at the Conservatory of Music in Santo Domingo. In 1981 he came to Philadelphia to study at Combs College of Music with David Grunschlag, and later with William Liva, former assistant to Ivan Galamian. He holds a bachelor of music in performance as well as a master of music in performance and education. Piantini has performed with many orchestras and ensembles in the area including the Reading, Delaware, Trenton and Lansdowne Symphonies, and the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia. With the latter two, he was not only violinist, but conductor.
