John S. Troiani, MD lives in Minneapolis, Minnesota where he practices general pediatrics, and plays piano for enjoyment. Born and raised in Bryn Mawr, PA, he began his piano studies at the age of 11 under Rita DiBello. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree from MIT in mechanical engineering, with a minor in music and a Masters in mechanical engineering from Stanford. He attended medical school in San Antonio, Texas, and completed his pediatric residency training at Albert Einstein Medical Center in Philadelphia. While in solo pediatric practice, Dr. Troiani has given piano recitals for medical fund raising projects. Dr. Troiani treasures his memorable ties to the great pianists of the past through his former teacher Helena Lewyn (a pupil of Josef Hofmann and Godowski), and presently studies piano with Dr. Stephanie Wendt of Minneapolis, a Curtis graduate, and a former student of Jorge Bolet.

Jack Moore, Music Director of the Independence Sinfonia, is quite active in the Philadelphia area. For 17 years, he was conductor of the South Shore Symphony Orchestra. In 1995, he was named Conductor of the Ambler Symphony, and was recently named Principal Conductor of the Orchestra Society of Philadelphia. He has appeared in concert with the Hradec Kralové Philharmonic in the Czech Republic, and with the Hermitage Chamber Orchestra in St. Petersburg. This season he has appeared twice with the State Philharmonic Orchestra of Vidin, Bulgaria, and will return for another concert there in June, 1999. Mr. Moore is a classical music announcer at Temple University Public Radio, WRTI, 90.1 FM.
